Dear President Biden and Members of Congress,

We are writing as the Circle of Protection, a coalition of churches and ministries with a combined membership of 100 million people. This letter is about pending issues that are especially important to people in poverty. Jesus identified with people in need - people who are hungry or thirsty, strangers, people who can't afford proper clothes, and prisoners (Matthew 25).

We applaud the leaders of Congress from both parties for reaching a compromise on the overall funding level for non-defense programs in the current fiscal year. We hope Congress will move quickly to finalize the appropriations bills.

A very high priority in FY2024 appropriations is funding to provide **WIC nutrition assistance** for all eligible women and children who apply. Congress has maintained this principle on a bipartisan basis for more than 25 years. We also urge you to protect funding for other poverty-focused programs such as housing, child care for low-income families, rural development, K-12 education, and poverty-focused international development.

International humanitarian assistance is a matter of life-or-death for many of the world's poorest people, so the \$11 billion for humanitarian assistance that the President has requested is also a high priority for us.

Finally, the **Child Tax Credit i**s one of the country's most powerful anti-poverty policies. Congress should not cut taxes for businesses without expanding the Child Tax Credit by an equal amount for low-income families who don't receive the maximum credit, prioritizing families with the greatest need.

We pray for each of you and all those in authority, with hopes for a more "quiet and peaceable life" (I Timothy 2:1-2) for the people of this nation.
