Dear Senator,

As leaders of a diverse group of Christian communities, we believe the Senate has an important opportunity and a clear responsibility to help vulnerable families and children. **The Senate should immediately pass the Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act (H.R. 7024)** to strengthen the Child Tax Credit and renew other tax provisions.

We commend the House for taking this critical step and urgently and prayerfully request that the Senate schedule a vote on this legislation and approve this lifeline for children and families.

No other legislation being considered during this Congress would do so much to reduce child poverty while also strengthening economic opportunities for families. The proposed Child Tax Credit expansions would lift as many as 400,000 children out of poverty and make an additional 3 million children in poverty better off. These provisions are targeted to those most in need, helping 16 million children in families who do not receive the full credit because the hard working adults in their families do not earn enough money to qualify for the maximum credit. The CTC improvements in the bill would make a real difference in the lives of many families in our communities.

There is strong bipartisan support for this bill. Politics should not derail this step forward for families and the nation. Our political leaders often express their desire to help children and families. This is a concrete and needed opportunity to match words with action. Failure to pass this bipartisan measure would be a failure of responsibility, compassion, and leadership.

We call on you to vote for and pass the Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act immediately upon returning from the April recess.
